Green Group

Levels of Cognition and communication from E1 to Level 1 - Group sizes of 10. Positive outcomes will include internal progression to supported to learn or Routes to College with opportunities to undertake meaningful work experience.

Blue group

 Levels of cognition and communication from P7 to E1 -Group sizes of 8. Positive outcomes will include supported learning with greater degrees of independence.

Purple group

 Students have primarily a need for a sensory diet, displaying characteristics that require either reduced sensory input or heightened sensory input. Group size 6

Yellow group

 Levels of cognition and communication around P4 to P7- Group sizes of 6. Positive outcomes will include supported living with improved communication. Support when transitioning out...

Frequently asked questions

Transport:

- We provide a bus service (unescorted) to our Rodbaston campus (<u>Transport – South Staffordshire College</u> (southstaffs.ac.uk))
- If you're young person requires transport to any of our other sites, or an escorted transport service, please contact your local authority SEND team. Deadline usually 31st May

Support:

- Support for your young person will be based on what is detailed within the EHCP
- Medication needed during college day: we have systems in place to store medication, and staff trained to administer (if needed)
- Reviews of EHCP's are annual from the date they were completed at previous setting (or held as an emergency, parents/externals given 2 weeks notice prior to meeting)

Applying/getting a place:

- Applications can be completed on our website (<u>SEND: Futures</u> & Cross College Supported Learning (CCSL) South Staffordshire College (southstaffs.ac.uk))
- College provision is a 3-day offer. If you want additional days, discuss with your local authority during the EHCP annual review
- For those young people with an EHCP, you will need to notify the school and local authority that South Staffordshire College is your desired progression destination to start consultation process
- Do they need a social worker to get a place: no, but it helps for coordinating external support, such as social care provision for additional days in the week when not attending college
