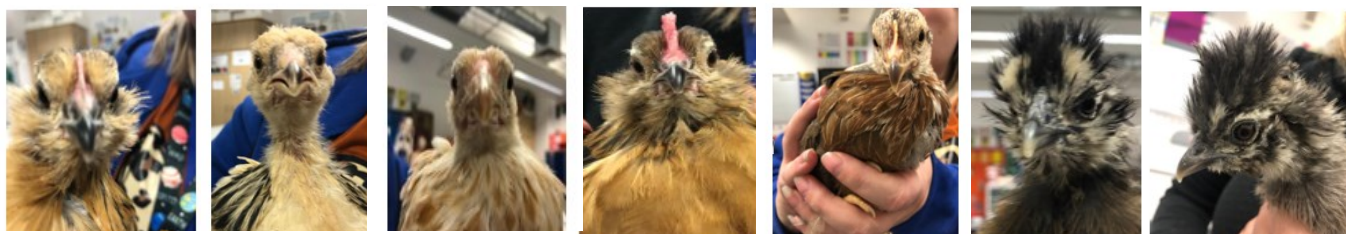
Chicken Update

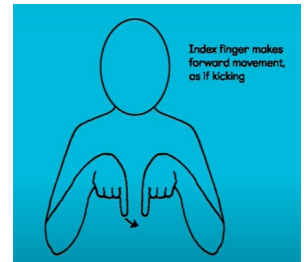
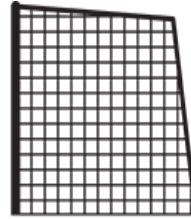
